

Submission guidelines

- 1) We only accept research papers authored or co-authored by CELSI research fellows or affiliates.
- 2) A research paper is understood to be academic work that contains original research or analytically reviews existing knowledge and is intended for publication in academic journal or as a chapter in an edited academic volume.
- 3) Submitted papers should cover issues related to Central and Eastern European (CEE) labour markets or broader labour issues. Empirical papers should be based on evidence at least in part covering CEE. Theoretical papers should cover labour issues that are relevant for CEE.
- 4) We accept contributions from all social science disciplines, including but not limited to economics, sociology, political science, public policy, social anthropology, human geography, social psychology and law. This way we aim to facilitate interdisciplinary dialogue and cross-fertilization of knowledge and ideas.
- 5) We only accept discussion papers written in English.
- 6) CELSI Discussion Paper series is non-rival in that we also accept papers that are published in other working or discussion paper series (the copyright stays with the author(s)). We think various outlets complement each other and ensure wider dissemination of knowledge, reaching to various complementary audiences. Please note, however, that we do not accept papers previously published as journal articles, chapters in edited volumes, or similar.
- 7) If your paper uses a dataset that contains data about CEE labour markets and is not yet listed in CELSI Databank (<http://www.celsi.sk/en/projects/details/2/celsi-databank/>), please send the relevant information (name, owner, links, etc) to dp@celsi.sk so that we can list this dataset and thereby provide for its wider dissemination.
- 8) The high academic standard of CELSI research fellows and affiliates ensures the academic quality of CELSI Discussion Paper series. While the series has an objective to disseminate fresh state-of-the-art knowledge and usually contains work in progress, please refrain from submitting largely unfinished work. We do not update online versions of submitted papers.

- 10) Please make sure that the body of your paper (introduction) starts on a separate page with page number 1.
- 11) Please send us abstract (<250 words), keywords, classification details if applicable (e.g. JEL classification), full names and affiliations of all co-authors, as well as complete contact information of the corresponding author.
